8. Staff Reports

- a. Stephen Valentine, Police Chief-
 - Chief Valentine read. The Winlock Police Department monthly call activity report to Mayor Svenson and the Council. There were (87) eighty-seven calls for December 2023. (YTD) Year to date there were (1,152) calls for 2023.
- b. Rodney Cecil, Water/Sewer superintendent -

Rodney submitted a report that includes a list of new upgrades. He mentioned that his goal is to start updating the older equipment so that we will have new and better warranties. We do have an application in to the Department of Ecology for a screw press to address our I&I problem. We're working on avenues to bring more grants to lessen loans. Council Member Bowers asked how old the PRVS are and hadn't been replaced. Rodney replied, they're pushing about seventeen (17) years. They blow quite often. The problem is they are about (\$8,000.00) eight thousand, so we have been staggering them. Council Member Camps asked if we were able to get a Grant for the upcoming upgrades for 2024. Council Member Allman said that we usually only get a Grant for a certain project.

9. PUBLIC COMMENT

Marty Poirrier – Mr. Poirrier, would like to discuss the animal ordinance that himself and newly annexed members of the City have been working on for a little over a year. The City Attorney was going to bring a draft of the ordinance but was not able to make the last meeting. Marty wants to make sure it's not forgotten or dropped. Rodney Cecil, Water/Sewer Ultra-Violet (UV) System Upgrade Fund Request Rodney gave a fund update to Mayor Svenson and the Council. #1, UV system upgrade, #2, Hycore replacement at the headworks, #3 Screw press project. Rodney has allotted (\$410,000.) four hundred and ten thousand dollars out of capital improvement for upgrades for the water and sewer system. Rodney would like to move forward with item #1, UV project. Rodney informed Mayor Svenson and the Council what our UV system is for when solids come out of our treatment zone exposed to ultraviolet light before they enter the creek, inactivates, and then kills them. Our UV system is outdated, and the parts are no longer available. Rodney wants to upgrade to a new UV retro system. Rodney got a quote for(\$133,000.00) from Nuvonic that includes a five-year warranty. Rodney, Mayor Svenson, and the Council discussed cost, and maintenance issues. Council Member Jeramy Allman Motion to Approve to take (\$133,000.) one hundred thirty-three thousand dollars out of Capital Improvement for UV Lighting System. Water/Sewer Superintendent, Rodney Cecil said he will be coming to the next Council meeting fund request for the Hycore replacement. Rodney said that he was going to put it off, but it broke down today and cost (\$40,000.) forty thousand dollars to fix. Will cost around (\$450,000.) four hundred fifty thousand dollars for engineering and planning. Fifty percent (50%) should be a grant, and fifty percent (50%) will be a loan. Rodney proposed that we should pull the (\$200,000.) two hundred thousand out of Capital Improvement so we don't have a loan with interest.

The Council and Rodney discussed water/sewer rates. Council Member Bowers commented that we should be informing the community of our water/sewer maintenance cost. Rodney replied that he goes out of his way to inform our community.

d. Transfer \$400,000 from Timberland Checking 410 Capital Fund and 404 Contingency to LGIP — Mayor Svenson stated that is where we put our savings as it is a high interest account. Council Member Jeramy Allman Motioned to transfer \$400,000 from Timberland Checking 410 Capital Fund and 404 Contingency. Second, by Council Member Lindsey Alvord, the Motion passed unanimously.
