8. Reports -

- **a. Kirsten Stalnaker, Parks** Kirsten, submitted a list of activities and general maintenance in Winlock Parks for this time period.
 - Mayor Svenson and the Council had a discussion regarding the incident pertaining to the miss communication between the City and the Picker fest Representatives. Clearly was a miss understanding on both parties on the activity of event permitting and non-communicating. Mayor Svenson said that he will reach out to their representatives for a little clarity and in hope to resolve any issues moving forward in the future.
- b. Robert Webster, Community Development Robert, submitted a report to the Mayor and the Council including an update on Developments that is going as follows. Grand Prairie Phase 3 has ten (10) houses left in Phase 5. Hawks View Heights has eight (8) homes left. Hidden Highlands have five (5), 4 plex's. Robert mentioned that he has had people talk to him about manufacturing home parks and thinks we need to write an Ordinance. Robert also said he would like to write a Resolution for a code to put into the Winlock Development Code that states all short-plats over two (2) lots and subdivisions must install fiber as a requirement of their development.
- c. Steven Valentine, Chief of Police Chief Valentine read the Winlock Police Department Monthly Call Activity Report. For the month of July There were one hundred and thirty-seven calls. Year to date there have been nine hundred and sixty-six calls (966). The Chief moved on to update the Mayor and the Council on our current booking charges.

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John McCarrol, John said he has concerns that there is only one stop sign at the corner of Cardinal and Roundtree. John feels that there should be a three-way stop on those streets. John said there is a lot of traffic, and kids are always crossing. Robert, City attorney, the Council, and Kathy discussed the primary reason, Ordinance Code for parking, but don't currently have a Code in place at this time.
